



Find the centre of your PandaWrap and hold it up to the middle of your chest making a band around your front.



Form a cross in the back by taking each side of the wrap under your arm and over the opposite shoulder.



Bring each side of the wrap to the front and make sure it is spread evenly across your back and shoulders.



Gather the two long pieces and tuck them inside and through the band of the wrap.



Tighten the wrap by pulling the edges of the fabric. The inside rail tightens the top and the outside the bottom. Make sure your wrap is snug to keep baby close.



Form another cross in the front by making an X with the fabric. This cross is where your baby will sit in the wrap. As you go make sure none of the wrap is twisted or bunched up.



Bring the tails of the wrap around to your back and you can either tie them in a square knot or if the fabric is long enough bring it around to the front to tie.



Tie the wrap in a square knot or double knot to be secure, they can be tied in the front or the back.

The cross on your chest shows where baby will sit, each leg will go on either side of the X.

The centre band will then be pulled up and over baby while in the cross carry.



Put baby on your shoulder and carefully insert one leg into the cross.

Tuck baby's second leg into the opposite side while supporting his back, Spread the fabric evenly across their bottom, back and shoulders.

Spreading the fabric is important for you and your baby's comfort.

Locate the band with the label and gently put both baby's legs through this section.

Pull the band with the label up and over baby making him snug and secure in the wrap.

Make sure the wrap is spread evenly across your back and shoulders for a comfortable fit.



These instructions are for the basic front wrap cross carry.

When learning it is helpful to watch yourself in a mirror as you put baby in.

For maximum comfort ensure your wrap is snug so baby is high on your chest. Having the wrap too loose will cause a strain on your back if baby is riding too low and not at your centre of gravity.

The PandaWrap can be used as long as you and baby are comfortable. The baby in this demonstration is thirty pounds and eleven months old!

A stretchy wrap is an excellent choice for newborns, especially preemies. Many small infants prefer to be carried upright and high on your chest next to your heart.

Organically grown bamboo is the perfect fabric to have next to baby's skin. Bamboo fabric is light and strong and naturally wicks away moisture and has a natural antibacterial property making it perfect for a wrap.

There are many different ways to tie a wrap making it versatile and convenient.
